





Message from the Head of School

What a packed week we have had for the last week of this half term!

The weather has improved and the sun has shone brightly this week. In light of this, after half term please consider applying sun-cream for your child before they leave for school, and send them to school with a sunhat or cap to keep the sun off their face whilst they are outside.

The warmer weather means that we are able to spend breaks and lunchtimes outside on our fabulous field. If your child suffers from hay-fever, this can be a trickier time of year. You can send anti-histamines (such as Piriton), which have been prescribed by the doctor for your child's hay-fever, into school if they may need a top-up of medication during the day – although many doctors can prescribe once-a-day tablets that can help stop your child from experiencing the unpleasant symptoms of hay-fever at bay throughout the day. If you do wish to bring medicine into school, please bring your medication in the original box with the label from the pharmacist on, so that we can see the required dosage for your child. You will need to fill in a medication form at the office, so that we have your permission to administer the medicine.

You may also want to send an extra bottle of drink into school as the weather warms up. It is extremely important to keep children hydrated – as this is vital in order for children to learn effectively.

It was wonderful to see how much fun the Year 6 children had at Drayton Manor Park on Thursday. I was delighted to hear how splendidly they behaved – although I expected nothing less – and I have heard about their adventures and escapades – what a fitting treat after so much hard work!

As the half-term holiday is now ahead – thoughts may turn to holiday adventures or visiting friend and families, going to the park or sporting activities. I hope that everyone stays safe and look forward to seeing you all back in school on Monday 5th May.

The times Tables check window opens and if your child is in Year 4, they will take the check at some point over the following two weeks (5th to 16th June). Daily time on the APP - Times Tables Rockstars —would be a great way for the children to keep their times tables skills up to speed over the half term holiday. Watch out for the PTA pre-loved uniform and book swap in the second week too — starting at 2pm in the school hall on Monday 12th June.

Trim Trail

In last week's edition of the newsletter, we asked parents to refrain from allowing their children to use the Trim Trail at the end of the school day.

However, we are still seeing children freely using the equipment after school. We have a robust risk assessment which states that children must be supervised by a trained member of school staff whilst on the trim trail, and due to discussions with parents and children as they are being dismissed, we cannot ensure these measures are in place. The trim trail is therefore closed to all children at the end of the school day.

This is because school has a duty of care to ensure the safety of all of our children at Scotch Orchard, which is why there is a robust risk assessment in place.



Although we know that the trim trail equipment is extremely enticing and the children really want to play, please can we ask you to support us at school to keep your children safe by preventing them from using the equipment at the end of the day.

This will be greatly appreciated - we particularly do not want anyone to get hurt.
