Mrs Savage will be working with identified children who are experiencing distress around a variety of issues, such as anxiety, bereavement, anger management difficulties, problems with recognising emotions, or emotional regulation and who have attachment problems. As you may recall from last week's newsletter, Cherished's goal is that all children feel safe, secure, soothed and seen so that they can learn effectively. This makes Mrs Savage an invaluable addition to our team with the exceptional pastoral offer that she will provide.

Finally, we are hoping to be joined by a Lead Designated Safeguarding Lead in September. This member of staff will work as part of the Senior Leadership Team with children, families and staff to ensure that all our children are safeguarded across school.
