

Message from the Head of School

We have had a very busy and successful week at Scotch Orchard this week. Our wonderful Year 1 children have been working tirelessly in their Phonics Screening Check. The Phonics Screening Check is a statutory phonics assessment for all Year 1 children, where the children are given an opportunity to display their phonics knowledge based on their learning since Early Years. Our staff have worked tirelessly to make the week a success and we are so proud of the children for all they have achieved. In addition, the Year 4 children have been working through the Times Tables Checks – they have been speedily recalling tables for the last two weeks and this will stand them in very good stead for their mathematical future!

Similarly, Year 1 and 2 had a fantastic trip to Conkers today. The children took part in a range of activities. The common favourite from the Key Stage One children was the sensory walk, where they walked over and through a ran of surfaces in barefoot. Both the children and adults found it very relaxing and soothing. We also enjoyed the opportunity to play together, problem solve and work as a team. Mr Chapman, Mrs Meer and Miss Crump were blown away by the children's outstanding behaviour; all of the children who went to Conkers wore the school badge with pride and represented our wonderful school beautifully. We are sure the children will sleep well tonight after such a busy day. A huge thank you must go to Mrs Meer and Miss Crump for organising such a safe and enjoyable trip for our lovely Year 1 children. We say farewell - but not goodbye - to Mrs Beale today. Mrs Beale has been working in our Year 3 and 4 class for the last two years and has been providing fantastic support for our

children. We wish her the best of luck with the delivery of her baby and know the whole school community will miss her very much.

This week I would like to talk a little e bit about how we use any additional adults that we may have in school to support children's learning. Most additional adults are paid for through money applied for by our SENDCo – Mrs Spires – in a very long process that requires school to have invested significant amounts of time and money previously to show that quality first teaching and interventions do not suffice. We have noticed that some children become very fixated on the specific adult in their class and this is a real problem if that member of staff is unwell, or not available for the children. As a result we have taken action and are moving additional adults into different classes throughout the week, so that all of our children can get to know all of the adults who provide support in school. These strong relationships will mean that issues like absences or training days will affect children less over time, and that when they have worries or concerns they have a much wider range of people to help them. If you have any worries or concerns about this, please do come and speak to Mr Chapman or myself in school.

To nurture and develop the true potential of every girl, building her confidence and establishing security in her own identity

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
