





### Message from the Head of School

What a beautiful day to end our week in school. The sunshine warmth has been gratefully received by both children and staff today. The sun was clearly shining on the righteous as the Year 5 children performed a marvellous 'Tudor' themed assembly to their families this morning. An array of songs, edge-of-your-chair acting and historical information was on display in a very special demonstration of learning by our Year 5 class. A massive thank you must go to Mrs Walton for organising such a great assembly and for all families for joining us. On Tuesday, we welcomed Tracey Ruddle, our School Improvement Partner, into school to meet the Senior Leadership Team. Tracey was once again very complimentary about the quality of teaching, adaptive learning environments and exemplary behaviour from our children during her time in school. We are extremely proud that the hard work and dedication of all staff in school has been recognised, and are delighted to be able to share this with our families. We continue to develop the quality of education received by the children and have seen significant improvements in Behaviour and Attitudes across school. However we are not complacent and are clear what the next steps for improvement are which include developing the use if assessment across school to close gaps in learning faster and to close the gaps in learning between disadvantaged and no-disadvantaged pupils.

Looking forward to next week, we are excited to welcome Richard Anderton, Digital Transformation Lead at the Arthur Terry Learning Partnership, into school on Monday to observe how effectively we have deployed our 1:1 iPads across school. We continue to be a flagship school for the ATLP because of the effective teaching and learning opportunities that we are providing our children using iPads. On Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June, our Year 5 children will be performing a range of guitar songs to their families at the Coton Centre in Tamworth. This will begin at 10:45am, with parents welcome to take their seats from 10:30am. On Friday afternoon, we will also be opening our school gates for the School Summer Fayre, which will run from 15:30. We continue to work collaboratively with our PTA to provide these wonderful opportunities for our school community.

You will have also received a letter today regarding the identity of your child's class teacher for next year. We know that transition can be a very unsettling time for many children and we have planned opportunities for children to get to know their new teacher in the coming weeks, including a 'Meet your new teacher' morning on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> July, in the last week of term. #### **Car Parking outside school**

Please can I remind all parents **to park considerately** when dropping off or collecting children from school. 
