Homework routines from September

In school we teach phonics using the Letters and Sounds programme. Once children have a secure knowledge of letter/sound correspondences and can blend words confidently, they access our Book Banded reading scheme, which will be carefully matched to their phonic level. In order to promote all children to develop a **love of reading**, we will be expecting them to read to an adult at home at least three times a week and record this in their reading diary. The children can also choose a book from our school library to enjoy at home.

Children will be set weekly Maths homework, including games and activities which will consolidate the learning taking place in school and further develop their fluency and confidence in Maths.
