Drop Off and Collection

Thank you for all your support with our drop off and collection procedures. As we are trying to keep the process swift, orderly and with everyone's safety in mind, we ask that you please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Only one adult to enter site at drop off and pick up
- Keep to the left along the path and driveway and keep your children with you please do not allow them to run ahead
- Maintain social distance from others at all times
- As you exit with your child, please keep moving to maintain a free-flowing route out of school

Please note: Children will only be released once you reach the front of the line

To further reduce congestion, staff will now stagger the dismissal of any child walking home alone, releasing them as the driveway clears

Booking Nursery and Breakfast Club - pre-booking now essential

From Monday 19th April, all Breakfast Club and Nursery paid afternoon sessions **must be prebooked and paid for** in advance, via ParentPay, using a similar process to ordering school lunches. This service is now live ready for your Summer term bookings.

To make a booking, please follow the simple steps below:

- Click on 'Make or View bookings and sessions'.
- Select 'Breakfast Club' or 'Nursery' from the dropdown box
- Select 'Book a session' for the day(s) required
- Make your payment in order to secure your booking

Confirmed Positive Cases over the Easter Holidays

Gov.uk have asked schools to continue with contact tracing over the Easter holidays. For the purpose of contact tracing, parents and carer need only inform us if a pupil '**tests positive within 2 days of the child being in their education setting**'. It is important that you use <u>covid19@scotchorchard.staffs.sch.uk</u> and not the office email as it is not monitored during the break.

Parents are asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst at school. If symptoms develop after 2 days, you do not need to inform us.

Where pupils test positive for Covid-19 more than 2 days since being at school, you will only need to inform us if they will be self-isolating when we return on 19th April. Please follow the contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.





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Wellbeing focus

Ensuring that all children feel safe and supported, has been a school priority after such a tumultuous year. Since returning to school, re-establishing daily routines and rebuilding relationships have both been focus areas across the whole school. Outdoor learning has been a wonderful way for the children to reconnect with their classmates. All year groups have had weekly activity afternoons with Forest School, Commando Joe, and team-building orienteering activities in PE. Highlights have included making animal shelters and hedgehog nests, nature inspired artwork, stick skeletons and even Greek ships made from twigs! As part of our RSE curriculum, we have been exploring 'caring friendships' and 'respectful relationships' through drama activities, role play and art. Year 1 and 2 have been thinking about the characteristics of a good friend, Year 3 and 4 have considered how our behaviour affects others and how we should celebrate mistakes, and Year 5 and 6 have been focusing on the characteristics of a good learner and resolving conflict in friendships.



Worry Boxes and Talk Tickets

We are mindful that the past year has been full of so many changes and challenges for our children.

To support our children's mental wellbeing, new Worry Boxes have been introduced in all classrooms and key areas throughout school. Children can request to speak to a member of staff by completing a Talk Ticket and posting it into one of the boxes.

We've already had really positive feedback from the children; they have found the Worry Boxes a reassuring way to reach out to someone to share any worries or concerns.
